JapanPhilly2020 celebrates the long friendship between Philadelphia and Japan with programs that highlight collaborations between our cultures at partner organizations, Shofuso, and throughout the region.

Shofuso and Modernism: Mid Century Collaboration Between Japan and Philadelphia. is a groundbreaking exhibition at Shofuso this summer. Presented in partnership with the Raymond Farm Center and George Nakashima Woodworker. This exhibition will tell the story of friendship and collaboration among Shofuso's Japanese architect, Junzo Yoshimura; midcentury modern architects and designers Antonin and Noemi Raymond; and Japanese-American carpenter George Nakashima.

The 30th Japan-America Grassroots Summit 2020, held in Philadelphia in October, will host 150 Japanese citizens for homestays with regional families, creating friendships and connections that will last a lifetime.


